



IN MEMORY OF

Joseph L'Sharp

May 1, 1933 - May 7, 2023



Joseph L Sharp (Joe) was a Native Nevadan, born on May 1, 1933, and was raised on the Sharp Ranch south of Alamo until he was 8 years old. He grew up riding his horse bareback without bridle or saddle all over the ranch. He often said that he lived a child's dream growing up on the ranch.

In his youth, Joe helped his Grandfather Lawrence Sharp and his Dad, Ainslee Sharp, raise cattle, put up hay with horse and wagon and rode the range.

At 19, Joe married his high school sweetheart, Dorlene Cutler, and they raised their family in Pahranagat Valley. Joe loved to rodeo and team roped at many events. His family was involved in the local Sagebrush Riders Club along with many friends in the valley that also enjoyed rodeoing and family campouts. Joe and Darlene loved to follow their kids, grandkids and great grandkids to gymnkhanas and other rodeo events.

Joe worked at NDOT for many years and retired in the position of a Supervisor. His favorite career though was that of a cattleman. One of his favorite mottos was "Always Ride for The Brand."

Joe loved his family, God, this Great Country of ours, Nevada, Lincoln County, and especially Pahranagat Valley and the Country way of life.

Joe passed away on May 7, 2023, after celebrating his 90th birthday and perhaps one of the last of his old cowboys raised in Pahranagat Valley.


Michael Jake Melson

After graduation from Pahranagat Valley High School in 1970, he attended Dixie College for a year where he was on the rodeo team. After returning home from college he started working construction.



Mike passed away October 8, 2022 at the age of 70.








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

2023-2024 Lincoln County Fair and Rodeo Royalty Contest Rules

The Lincoln County Fair and Rodeo Royalty Contest will be held at the Alamo, NV Fairgrounds on Wednesday, August 2nd, 2023. Dinner, Personal Interviews and Speeches will start at 5:00 pm and Horsemanship will follow.

Winners of the 2023-2024 Lincoln County Fair and Rodeo Royalty Contest will be crowned at 6:30 pm on August 11, 2023, before the grand entry of Friday's performance of the rodeo.

- Contestants are limited to Lincoln County residents or girls who currently have family living in Lincoln County. If participation is low, we will accept girls from surrounding counties.
- 2. Queen contestants must be ages 13 through 18 by August 11, 2023.
- Princess contestants must be ages 9 through 12 by August 11, 2023.
- Tiny Princess contestants must be ages 5 through 8 by August 11, 2023.
- $5. \quad \text{The contestants will be judged on the following:} \\$
 - a. Poise and Personality
 - b. Appearance
 - c. Modeling
 - d. Horsemanship
 - e. Personal Interview
 - f. Speech and Impromptu Questions
- 6. Contestant must not currently be holding the title for which she is running. In the event a title has been relinquished and the 1st attendant has finished the reign, that contestant shall be able to run for said title again.

- 7. Title holder must not have been married. She must refrain from public displays of affection.
- 8. Title holder must not use tobacco or alcoholic beverages, even if of legal age to do so.
- Title holder shall refrain from unnecessary texting or calling while representing Lincoln County.
- 10. Title holder must not be associated with illegal drugs.
- 11. Title holder must not use profanity in their language.
- 12. Title holder will be required to sell raffle tickets before and during the Fair. Moneys raised from the raffle tickets will go towards awards and travel money for the 2023-2024 royalty winners.
- 13. Title holder is required to represent Lincoln County during the Fair and Rodeo and at different functions throughout the year. They must be present and participate both days of the Fair and Rodeo grand entry. They must also represent the Fair and rodeo in at least 3 county events during their reign. Such as LCHS and/or PVHS Homecoming Parades, Labor Day Parade in Pioche, Homecoming Parade in Caliente, Rachel Days Parade in Rachel, 4th of July Parade in Alamo, or Caliente, or Pioneer Days Parade in Panaca. It will be optional for Queens and/ or Princesses to represent Lincoln County at out of county events. Such as Dixie Round-Up Rodeo in St. George, PRCA Rodeo in Cedar City, and Clark County Fair and Rodeo in Logandale, High School Rodeos, College Rodeos, and/or JR rodeos. They will be required to assist with the following year's Royalty Contest by demonstrating the pattern for the contestant, and to be present at the following year's grand entry of the Rodeo performances to pass down

- their crown to that year's winner.
- 14. Title holder is required to assist at the Pee-Wee rodeo on Saturday.
- 15. These requirements must be completed in order to receive the travel money. Failure to appear as required will forfeit travel money. All travel money will be paid at the end of the Royalty annual reign at the last Fair appearance.
- 16. If title holder should marry or become pregnant before the end of her rein, she will forfeit the crown and any prizes awarded to her.
- 17. In the event that there are no persons running for the next Reign Royalty, current reining royalty will be automatically reinstated for another term.
- 18. MOST IMPORTATLY: HAVE FUN AND ENJOY THIS EXPERENCE. It is an HONOR to represent Lincoln County and the sport of Rodeo at the same time.

Entries and fees must be received by July 22nd, 2023. Entry fee for the contest is \$25, payable by check made out to Lincoln County Fair. Contestants will receive their packets and patterns after submitting their entry form and fee. 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

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

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NEVADA FARM BUREAU FEDERATION

Lincoln County Farm Bureau is involved in Ag in the Classroom. Provides support to Lincoln and Pahranagat Valley FFA chapters. LCFB also partners with the local soil conservation districts in projects for member education and sage grouse habitat improvement. LCFB was also instrumental in resurrecting the Lincoln County Fair in 2009.

4-H Exhibits — General Rules & Regulations

ENTRIES

- 1. Competition in all Divisions is open to all children between the ages of 9-19 who are CURRENTLY enrolled in the Lincoln County 4-H program.
- If a currently-enrolled 4-H child wants to enter a private project (and he or she is not enrolled in that Club), then the project MUST be registered with the Extension Office (775-726-3109) by July 1, 2023. Each private project is subject to inspection at any time by 4-H Leaders and/or the Extension Office.
- 3. Each exhibit must be checked in by the child, parents, or Club Leader with the 4-H Registrar in order for it to be displayed.
- 4. All entries must be received between 11:00 AM to 1:00 PM on Wednesday, August 9, 2023.

EXHIBITS

- 1. Exhibits must be entirely the work of the child submitting the exhibit, and must have been completed within the last year (since the last Lincoln County Fair).
- 2. Exhibits must be identified with tags provided by the 4-H Leaders through the Extension Office.
- 3. The child's name will not be shown until the judging has been completed.
- 4. All exhibits must remain on display until 5:00 pm on Saturday, August 12.
- 5. It is the responsibility of each child (or parents) to pick up his or her exhibits on Saturday, August 12, 2023 between 5:00 pm 6:00 pm, or to make arrangements for them to be picked up.
- 6. The Exhibit Hall will be locked nightly. Lincoln County 4-H will not be responsible for loss or damage, but will use every reasonable precaution to protect the entries.

JUDGING & AWARDS

- 1. Entries in each Class will be eligible to receive a blue, red, or white ribbon.
- 2. One "Grand Champion" and one "Reserve Champion" award will be given to the top two entries in each Section with blue ribbons only. These awards will be given to those entries that show excellence in workmanship, overall appearance, beauty and originality of design, and harmony of color and material.
- 3. In addition, one "Judge's Choice" award will be given in each Section.
- 4. Cloverbuds (5-8 year-olds) will only be eligible to receive a Participation ribbon.
- 5. Only Judges and Clerks may be present in the area while judging is taking place.
- 6. If it is found that any 4-H exhibitor has obtained an award in violation of any of the 4-H Rules, that exhibitor will forfeit all awards, and must return the ribbons to the 4-H Council or Extension Office.

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
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

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Exhibits - General Rules & Regulations

Entries

- Competition in ALL Divisions are open to all and only Lincoln County residents.
- 2. Please note the special regulations for exhibit entries in each division.
- Entries may be delivered and displayed only after exhibitor has obtained a tag and exhibitor number from the registrar.
- ALL entries must be received between 12:00 PM and 7:00 PM on Wednesday, August 9, 2023.
- 5. Contact Cindy Higbee with any questions, 702-271-9790.

Exhibits

- Exhibits must be handiwork of the exhibitor and must have been completed within the last year.
- Exhibits may enter more than one entry per class, and may enter as many classes as desired, unless stated otherwise. A "set" is classified as one entry.
- 3. The exhibitor is responsible for deciding on the proper division, section, and class per entry.
- 4. Exhibits may be disqualified if found soiled, damaged, or have signs of excessive wear.
- 5. Exhibitor's name will not be shown until the judging has been completed.
- Exhibits must be identified with tags provided by Registrar or available online.
- 7. Any exhibit in questionable taste will not be accepted for public display.
- 8. The Exhibit Hall will be locked nightly.
- All exhibits are entered and displayed at the risk of the owner.
- 10. All exhibits must remain on display until Saturday between 5:00 pm and 6:00 pm and must be picked up by exhibitor at that time.
- 11. Lincoln County Fair Board will not be responsible for loss or damage, but will use every reasonable precaution to protect entries.
- 12. No exhibits may be advertised for sale.
- 13. Exhibitors of machinery in motion or other exhibits susceptible to accident shall safeguard said exhibits; shall protect the public from injury by or danger from said exhibits, shall relieve the Lincoln County Fair Board and volunteers from and against all claims, demands, cost charges, and/or expenses that the Lincoln County Fair Board or volunteers may suffer by reason of negligence of the exhibitor, and shall reimburse the Lincoln County Fair Board for necessary expenses incurred to protect the public from said exhibit.

Judging & Awards

 Grand Champion and Reserve Champion awards will be given to the top two entries in each Section.

- 2. When there is a single entry in a Section, the award will be made on merit alone.
- Entries will be judged on: workmanship, overall appearance, beauty and originality of design, and harmony of color and material.
- 4. Only Judges and Registrar may be present in the area while judging is taking place.
- 5. Judging will take place at 8:00 am on Thursday, August 10, 2023.
- Should it be found that any exhibitor has obtained an award by false evidence or violation of any Fair Rules, said exhibitor shall forfeit all awards.

- 5. All perishable foods will be judged on presentation. All food products opened and/or tasted by the judges will be discarded after the Fair if not picked up.
